Vero Beach Museum of Art –*Victorian Radicals: From the Pre-Raphaelites to the Arts & Crafts Movement*

In the second half of the 19th century, three generations of young and rebellious artists and designers revolutionizes the visual arts in Britain, engaging with and challenging the new industrial word around them. The Pre Raphaelites Brotherhood, William Morris and his associates, and the champions of the Arts and Crafts Movement offered a radical artistic and social vision that found inspiration in the pre-industrial past and came to decisively influence visual culture in Britain and beyond. Drawn from the outstanding collection of the city of Birmingham, United Kingdom, *Victorian Radicals* will bring together paintings, works on paper, and decorative arts – many never shown outside of the UK – to illuminate this dynamic period of British art.
