The Buggy Bunch Reveals New Artwork on their Downtown Building

The Buggy Bunch has reached out to the Centennial Committee to recognize the 100th birthday of Vero Beach. As the owners of a "new home" for their organization, located on 21st Street in historic downtown Vero Beach and previously the Vero Furniture Mart annex store, they have enlisted an artist to paint a mural that is currently installed on the outside of their building.

Created and painted by artist Pamela Willoughby daughter of Buggy Bunch Board Member Sue Carter, the art shows the bridge over the intercoastals waterway and a banner conceived from the centennial logo, along with the Buggy Bunch logo.
